**TIGER TRUST**, in association with Nature Club of Rajasthan (NGO) and Dy. Conservator of Forests, wildlife (Jaipur), organized, **Padmashree Kailash Sankhala Memorial Wildlife Conservation week** from 1st Oct. to 7th Oct., 2013 at Jaipur Rajasthan.

During the week-long celebrations, following events were organised by involving thousands of students of the Capital Jaipur.

1. Paryavaran Pathshala
2. Film Festival on Wildlife
3. Competition on Wildlife topics



The Programme **Paryavaran Pathshala** (means forest for environmental studies) was organised at Nahargarh Biological Park, Amer, Jaipur. The Park is a part of Nahargarh Wildlife Sanctuary and have a rescue center of wild animals.

Every day, school students were taken to the park & they were taught about the flora, fauna & biodiversity of the area.

Journey for nature study began with an introductory lecture by Dr. Suraj Ziddi, an eminent wildlife ecologist by telling Do's & Don't... and what to be seen... where to be seen and how to observe the natural world... during the visit.

Excitement & joy reached on peak, when students roamed around the open enclosures of tiger, leopard & lions of the rescue center. Roaring of tigers thrilled them and elephant safari by foreigners in jungle also added pleasure to their visit. Further, while walking on nature trails, they were also briefed about identification of plants, trees, shrubs, insects, butterflies, birds, animals & nature



photography etc. by trained & expert members of the Nature Clubs. The were taken in valleys of dense forest for bird watching & experience the lore of Jungle. After more then 3 hours field visit, they were brought to Rose Garden to take lunch, rest & play. In last, some quiz, on what they have observed, were conducted and gifts were given to them.



This way an effort was made to educate about importance of wildlife conservation & ecosystem study to more than 3500 students of 20 school of the capital.

Infact, paryavaran Pathshala is a thoughtfully designed nature education & awarness programme in which students are taken out to Jungle for learning about, How the Mother Nature works. What is the ecosystem of the forests.

**FILM FESTIVAL ON WILDLIFE**
